<p>Community Groups What have community/volunteer groups tried to do in Dover? How have they tried to go about it? What does this tell you about the difference people can make?</p>		
<p>Media What role did the media play in creating some of the problems? Can you think how it can be used to help solve the problems now? Have things improved?</p>		
<p>Conflict What conflicts exist in the area? Why do you think there are conflicts? Do you think they can be dealt with in a better way? What are people doing to solve this problem?</p>		
<p>Law How is the situation affected by the legal rights asylum seekers can claim? What other laws have been important for events in Dover? Which other groups have been affected?</p>
