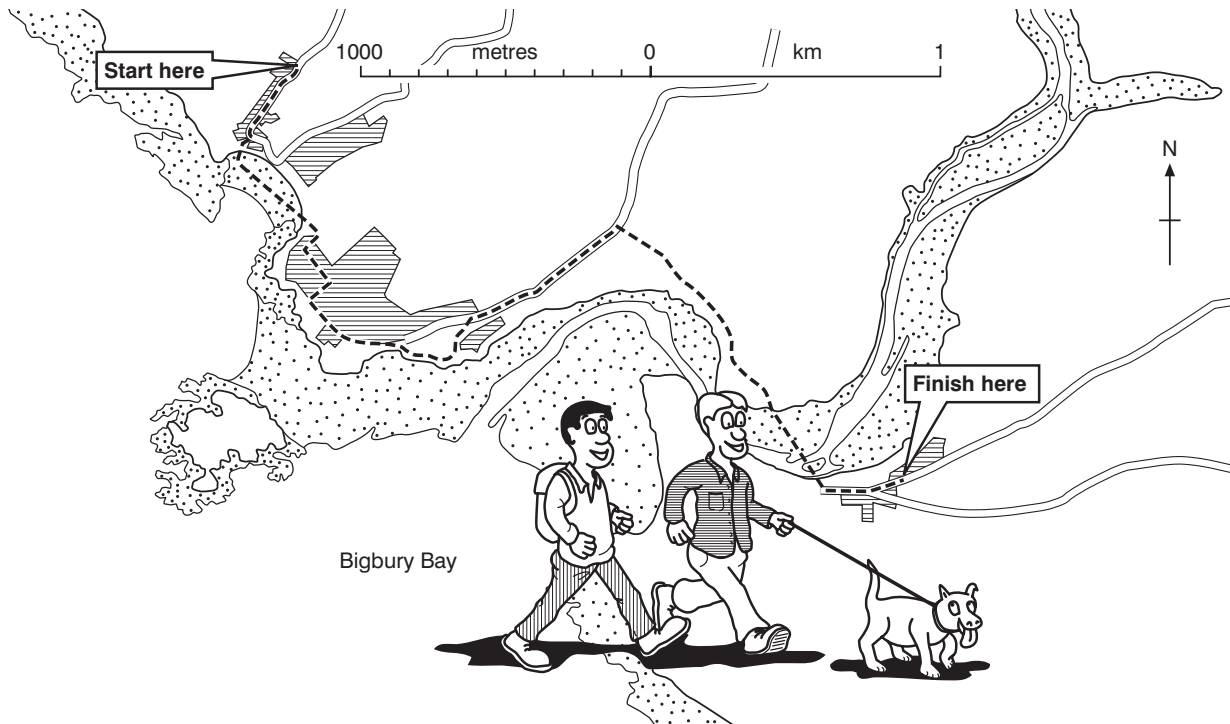


# A coastal walk in South West England
